Khammouane Agricultural Development Cooperative Established

The Khammouane Agricultural Development Cooperative was officially established

on January 9, 2017 at a meeting chaired by the Vice Governor of Khammouane Province, Mr. Bounmy Phimmasone, and attended by twenty-five cooperative members and other participants.



The cooperative is expected to boost economic growth in the local agricultural

sector. The chairperson stressed the importance of policy and funding support to strengthen the cooperative and help it become sustainable. At the end of the meeting, a new administrative committee was elected to operate the cooperative.



New Market Opportunities for Myawaddy Maize Farmers

To explore new market opportunities for Myawaddy maize farmers, the EWEC project introduced them to maize trad-

ers from Tet Kone and the Sunjin Feed Factory on January 2 to 4, 2017. This was the first time the traders and feed factory visited Myawaddy where they discussed purchasing requirements and processes and also checked the quality and volume of the maize.





End-of-Crop Year Celebration and Learning Workshop

To pave the way for better cooperation in the future, a year-end workshop was held in collaboration with the Khe Sanh Coffee Association (KCA) on January 12 to 13, 2017 in Huong Hoa district of Quang Tri province, Vietnam. The work-

shop assessed the 2016 crop year and promoted information exchange, cooperation and learning among SMEs and Farmer Groups (FGs) and developed the direction for the years to come.

In attendance were representatives of SMEs and FGs who were involved in the linkage project, as well as local authorities and non-government organizations such as KOICA-sponsored Happiness Program, Plan in Quang Tri, and the EMEE Project of World Vision.



Looking back over the past three years since the project's establishment:

- 22 FGs were established and 591 members joined
- 2016 saw a successful crop-year with higher prices although productivity was lower, due to weather conditions and farmers' cultivating practices
- 15 FGs linked with SMEs for a transaction volume of 3,389 tons of coffee cherry which brought USD 1,324,264 in total revenue
- Added value per FG member was more than USD 170
- According to the assessment of SMEs and relevant parties, the project interventions in the past three years made great contributions to the development of the coffee sector
- International markets have given special attention to KCA because of the improved quality.
- It is expected that 2017 will see stable market prices and higher productivity if existing achievements are maintained and strengthened.

Strategy Training to Cooperative Members



A three-day intensive training was organized at the Department of Industry and Commerce (DIC) in Khammoune Province, Lao PDR from January 17 to 19, 2017

to transfer knowledge on organizational development strategies and to build up participants' capacity to apply management, planning and analytical tools to their organizations. Chaired by Mr. Thongxay
