Supported by the Lancang-Mekong Cooperation (LMC) Special Fund, the project endeavors to strengthen cooperation in hydropower projects and promote the mitigation of associated climate change impacts in the Lancang-Mekong countries of Cambodia, P.R. Training on GAP Standards Seek to Support Farmer Groups

A training on Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) Standards was delivered to farmer groups from Ban Phai, Huaybak, Thuad and Phonthong in Champhone district, Savannakhet last October 15-22, 2018. Over 60 farmers joined the training, which aimed to further strengthen farmer groups' knowledge of integrated pest control management, pre- and post-harvest management, and internal control system.



Corn Farmers Join Training on Cost-effective Crop Production

More than 400 farmers from 14 farmer groups participated in a series of trainings organized by EWEC Project Myanmar's partner, Awba Input Company from October 1-7, 2018. The trainings were held in eight villages in the southern part of Myawaddy and six villages from the north. The trainings were to further strengthen the capacity of famers in the application methods of the local inputs provided by Awba Company and boost yields using low-cost cultivation practices.



Roll out of Business Linkage Model among Maize Value Chain Actors Continues

As part of ongoing efforts to roll out the business linkage model, the RLED-EWEC Project Myanmar Team organized a meeting among key players in the maize value chain on October 28 at Hpa-luu Gyu and Sone See Myaing villages, Myawaddy.

The meeting provided more information to the maize value chain actors on the domestic maize market, procurement practices of local markets, future activities on contract farming for extended farmer groups, and payment mechanisms between maize farmer groups, input companies and local brokers/collectors. Some farmer groups also brought maize samples to clarify moisture level and prices based on product quality, as well as the transportation charges form the village to domestic markets.



Training Seeks to Advance CBTF Efforts

On October 3, the EWEC Project Vietnam Team, in cooperation with relevant agencies in Quang Tri province, hosted the training on Process and Procedures of Goods and Vehicle Clearance and Immigration at Lao Bao International Border Gate, Quang Tri Province as part of continuing efforts to advance cross-border trade facilitation.

In attendance were representatives of relevant government agencies and more than 60 cross-border trading enterprises in the province. The one-day event discussed the process and procedures for crossing the Lao Bao bordergate and thereby reduce time and costs for enterprises and traders. Agencies such as the Customs Sub-Department, Plant Quarantine Station, Animal Quarantine Station and Border Army facilitated the training and open discussions.
