Media Outlets Help Boost Rice Market Development



MI and DoA Join Forces for Project Survey in Myawaddy

On July 14, the Myanmar Field Office tapped on the Department of Agriculture to help redesign and implement the survey, which will be used in August to quantify the total maize farmers, maize cultivated land area and other useful information related to assessing project reach and impact. To date, the project has increased the household income of nearly half of the 2,000-targeted maize farmers.

Meeting Links Microfinance Company and Smallholder Farmers

EWEC Myanmar organized a meeting on July 24-25 between Microfinance Delta International Company Ltd. (Mifida) and maize farmers in Northern and Southern Myawaddy to facilitate farmer access to loans. The meeting served as an opportunity for Mifida Company to offer and explain their seasonal loans and at the same time, help farmers understand the terms and conditions, requirements and payment modalities affixed to the loans.



Maize Growers Brush Up on Soil, Seed and IPM Knowledge

A training on soil, seed and plant protection was conducted on July 30, 2019 in Pha Lu Gyi Village in Myawaddy, Myanmar. Gathering 70 maize farmers from seven villages, the training intended to improve the knowledge of smallholder farmers on the proper management of maize production to help increase their product quality and market competitiveness. Experts from the Department of Agriculture discussed best practices along the value chain including Integrated Pest Management (IPM) and how to effectively control Fall Armyworm (FAW) which is a common problem among farmers in the Myawaddy region.

MI Highlights TH-LAO Agri Trade in Import-Export Training Program

A total of 50 cross-border traders, farmers, farm managers and agricultural merchants joined the training on *Cross-border Trade Procedures of Agricultural Products* held on July 30-31, 2019 in Nakhon Phanom, Thailand. Aimed at strengthening import-export transactions between Nakhon Phanom and Khammouane, Lao PDR, the training covered topics on cross-border trade standards and policies as well as up-to-date practices and procedures. The training program was jointly organized by MI and the Office of Commercial Affairs, through the support of the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation.

OTHER ACTIVITIES

MI Speaks at ESCAP Meeting on Non-Tariff Measures

MI Executive Director Dr. Watcharas Leelawath served as one of the discussants in the expert group meeting on Navigating Non-Tariff Measures toward Sustainable Development held on July 11-12, 2019 in Bangkok, Thailand. Dr. Leelawath provided insights on how non-tariff measures and trade agreements promote the use of international standards, with reference to the food and agriculture sectors.

Meeting with GMS-FRETA and JSCCIB Explores Avenues for Collaboration

On July 15, MI attended a meeting with the GMS Freight Transport Association and the Joint Standing Committee on Commerce, Industry and Banking to discuss potential areas for cooperation following their support at the Joint Mekong Forum and GMS Logistics Forum 2019. MI Executive Director Dr. Watcharas Leelawath made a presentation on MI projects in promoting cross-border trade and logistics with Thailand and neighboring countries. The respective organizations affirmed commitment to advancing logistics development in the region.

MI Supports The 40th PAFTAD Conference

MI, along with other partner organizations, participated in PAFTAD 40: New dimensions of connectivity in the Asia Pacific last July 17-19, 2019. Held in Bangkok, Thailand, the conference gathered opinion leaders and development actors to weigh in on issues, challenges and opportunities of regional integration, connectivity and inclusive growth. As one of the session discussants, Dr. Watcharas Leelawath talked about the impacts of urbanization and infrastructure development in the GMS.
