Session 5.3.: Attribution and Contribution Analysis

- Develop an understanding that attribution can actually only be measured through conducting randomized controlled trials.
- Develop an understanding of the differences between regular evaluations,
 quasi-experimental designs, and randomized controlled trials.
- Develop an understanding of the approach to conduct contribution analysis.

- To develop a deeper understanding of contribution analysis as a tool to develop a more nuanced understanding of change in society.
