#### **Background**

# 1.1. The Association of Southeast Asian Nations

The Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) was established on August 8, 1967, in Bangkok, Thailand, with the signing of the ASEAN Declaration by Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, and Thailand. Since then, ASEAN has expanded to include Brunei Darussalam (1984), Vietnam (1995), Lao PDR and Myanmar (1997), and Cambodia (1999), forming a ten-member regional bloc representing over 600 million people across 4.5 million km².

To commemorate the founding of this political and economic union, ASEAN Day is observed annually on August 8. This marks ASEAN's dedication to regional cooperation and integration among Southeast Asian nations. Each ASEAN Day, member states engage in activities that promote regional solidarity, highlight ASEAN's achievements, and reinforce its objectives. This celebration underscores the founding ideals of ASEAN, emphasizing the importance of regional collaboration in addressing shared challenges, fostering economic growth, and enhancing cultural understanding. By celebrating ASEAN Day, member countries honor ASEAN's foundational ideals and reaffirm their commitment to working together as one cohesive community, striving towards shared goals for the betterment of the region.

#### 1.2. The KKU Centre for ASEAN Study

Khon Kaen University's Center for ASEAN Study serves as a hub for disseminating knowledge about the ASEAN Community to society and academic institutions, particularly in Northeast Thailand. Its mission includes conducting research on ASEAN-related topics, such as the economy, social and cultural planning, law, and security development. The Center also focuses on building networks for the exchange of experiences and fostering relationships with academic, governmental, and private organizations.

In line with the 2022 Khon Kaen University Implementation Plan, the Center plays a pivotal role in the internationalization strategy of the university. This involves collaboration and development with ASEAN countries in areas such as instruction, research, innovation, academic service, and business networking. The Center aims to promote education, research, and knowledge creation on various aspects of the ASEAN Community. Additionally, it seeks to enhance instruction, research, and academic services through partnerships with universities, faculties, and organizations both domestically and internationally.

#### 1.3. Mekong Institute

Mekong Institute (MI), headquartered in Khon Kaen, Thailand and jointly owned and governed by China, Cambodia, Lao PDR, Myanmar, Thailand, and Viet Nam, is an intergovernmental organization committed to deepening regional cooperation and integration. MI focuses on capacity development, dialogue, and advocacy for sustainable socioeconomic development in the Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS).

In 2021, MI was honored with the ASEAN Prize for its outstanding contributions to promoting subregional development and advancing regional integration and cooperation. Administered by the ASEAN Secretariat, the ASEAN Prize is a prestigious annual award that recognizes exceptional achievements by individuals or organizations in ASEAN who have significantly contributed to community-building efforts. As an ASEAN Prize recipient, MI has demonstrated its expanding role from a GMS-focused entity to a reputable organization supporting broader regional frameworks such as ASEAN.

MI strives to be a center of excellence in human resource development, a leading think tank, and a convener for dialogue and collaboration. The Institute brings together stakeholders to advance development agendas in key areas such as agriculture, trade and investment, and sustainable energy and environment. Additionally, MI addresses critical cross-cutting themes including social inclusion and vulnerability, the digital economy and innovation, and labor mobility to ensure holistic and meaningful impacts across the region.

## 57th ASEAN Day at Khon Kaen University

Inspire New Aspirations for the Region: Encourage new ideas and partnerships that advance ASEAN's principles and address future challenges, paving the way for continued regional growth and integration.
