# Celebrating a Decade of Enhanced Regional Cooperation for Sustainable Agriculture Future

#### **BACKGROUND**

#### The ASEAN Climate Resilience Network (ASEAN-CRN)

was established in 2014 by the ASEAN Technical Working Group on Agriculture (ATWGARD) as a vital platform for regional collaboration on climate-smart agriculture (CSA). This network was created in response to the urgent need for ASEAN Member States (AMS) to enhance their adaptive capacities in the agriculture sector, particularly in light of the increasing impacts of climate change.

Over the past decade, ASEAN-CRN has played a crucial role in fostering dialogue among policymakers, researchers, and practitioners, significantly advancing the agenda of agriculture and climate change within the region.



During the past ten years, ASEAN-CRN has achieved several key milestones:

Establishment of ASEAN Negotiating Group on Agriculture (ANGA)

A major accomplishment of the network is the formation of ANGA, which represents ASEAN's interests in international negotiations on agriculture under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC). This group has been instrumental in shaping policies that address both agricultural development and climate resilience.

Knowledge sharing and capacity building

The network has facilitated numerous knowledge exchange events and collaborative initiatives that promote CSA practices across AMS. These efforts include national studies assessing vulnerabilities in food crops and documenting best practices for enhancing resilience.

**Policy development** 

ASEAN-CRN has contributed to the endorsement of regional guidelines for promoting CSA practices by the ASEAN Ministers of Agriculture and Forestry (AMAF). This endorsement signifies a collective commitment to integrating climate resilience into agricultural policies across member states.

The 10th Anniversary of ASEAN-CRN represents a pivotal moment in the network's collective efforts towards sustainable agrifood transformation in response to climate change. Under the theme "Celebrating a Decade of Enhanced Regional Cooperation for a Sustainable Agricultural Future," this event aims to strengthen collaboration and facilitate knowledge sharing among stakeholders, ensuring that our agricultural systems remain resilient and capable of meeting the needs of our populations.

Thailand's Department of Agriculture (DOA) currently serves as the Chair of ASEAN-CRN and is hosting this milestone event, which is co-organised by the Mekong Institute (MI) and the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) in partnership with the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH, Winrock International and Global Green Growth Institute (GGGI). This leadership reflects Thailand's commitment to strengthening regional cooperation and addressing agriculture challenges intensified by climate variability.
